Events and Public Service Ops

26-27 September 2009: The Texas QSO Party. The Texas QSO Party for 2009 will be held on September 26-27, 1400-0200Z (9am-9pm) Saturday and 1400-2000Z (9am-3pm) Sunday. The ARRL Contest Branch declared 2009 to be the 'Year of the State QSO Party', which means the level of activity in this year's Texas QSO Party may set records.

Stations within Texas contact stations anywhere, and stations outside Texas contact as many stations in Texas as they can. Texas stations send a signal report and their Texas county. Stations outside Texas send a signal report and their state, Canadian province, or country. Phone contacts count 2 points; CW and digital contacts 3 points. For Texas stations, the number of QSO points is multiplied by the sum of different Texas counties, states, Canadian provinces, and countries worked.

Suggested frequencies for phone contacts are 25 KHz above the bottom of the General class segments (except for 10m, where the suggested frequencies are 28.3 – 28.5 MHz), for CW contacts, 40-60 KHz above the bottom of the band, and for VHF, 50.200 and 144.200 MHz.

1. Officer Reports

- a. **President's Report:** Bob Kirby (K3NT) referred the members to his article in "Signals" that was recently published.
- b. **Vice-President's Report:** Ross Terry (K5SRT) reported on the status of club T-shirts, discussed in old business.
- c. **Secretary's Report:** Dwight Ramsey, KE5SAS. The report was accepted as published in the July Signals.
- d. **Treasurers Report:** Robert Diepenbrock (KC4UAI) was absent but provided data for Bob Kirby to report. Bob reported that the current bank balance has increased due primarily to the club receiving its yearly stipend check from the company. The time to receive the check was significantly longer than in previous years. This was because it is believed that the process has changed. In previous years the club was allocated a budget and a check was written. This year a check was not written until after all purchase receipts from the previous year were submitted. Among the members attending, the consensus was that

this process would make it difficult for the club to plan for the future since not only would there be uncertainty in coverage by the company but also timeliness of the refund. Kirby with Swan support will obtain clarification of the process from company organizations.

- e. **Station Trustee's Report:** There was no Station Trustee's report.
- f. **Activities Chairman Report:** There was no Activities Chairman report, as the office is currently unfilled.

2. Old Business

- a. **Club T-Shirts:** Ross reported that he had met recently with a t-shirt vendor that other RC organizations had used. During the radio club meeting a design was settled upon. Ross is awaiting the receipt of a catalog to select a shirt style and color. W5ROK will proceed independent of sister clubs in obtaining the t-shirts. Several members indicated they would purchase a shirt when available.
- b. **RFI in the Shack:** No status was provided on this issue.
- c. **Meeting Programs:** In the interim until the activity chairperson position is filled, Loney Duncan (W0ZGV) is pursuing speakers for the next few meetings.
- d. **Club Elections:** Bob Kirby indicated that club rules prevent him from running a second time for president. He encouraged all members to volunteer for the officer positions that will be voted on at the September meeting.

3. New Business

- a. There was no new business.

The meeting concluded with members discussing various techniques for gaining greater participation at the meeting and in recruiting new members. The meeting closed at 7:00 PM.

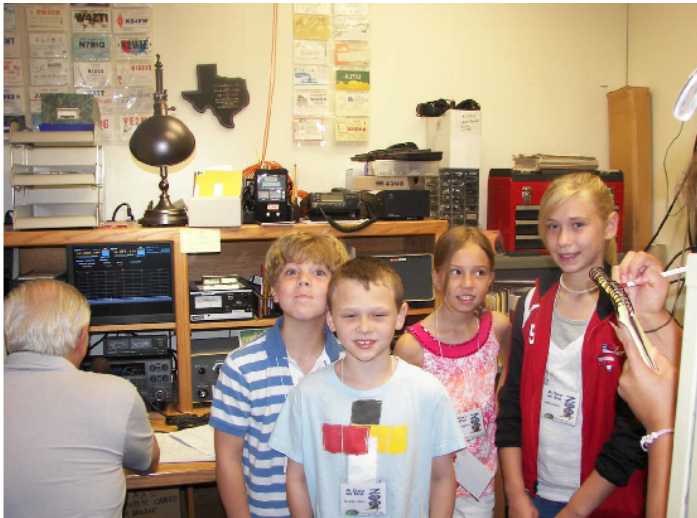
Ham On A Map. Would you like to see the Ham's in your area plotted on a map try out N4MC's Ham Locator? At <http://www.vanityhq.com/> can be found in the left tool bar area an icon that looks like push pens on a map. It allows you to enter Zip codes, select a map size and then plots pens based on the FCC call sign database address. You can then zoom in and place your mouse over the push pen, and see information on that operator or club. The first time the program starts with information that existed when the tool was developed so you want to refresh it. The clubs push pen is located at our P.O. Box.

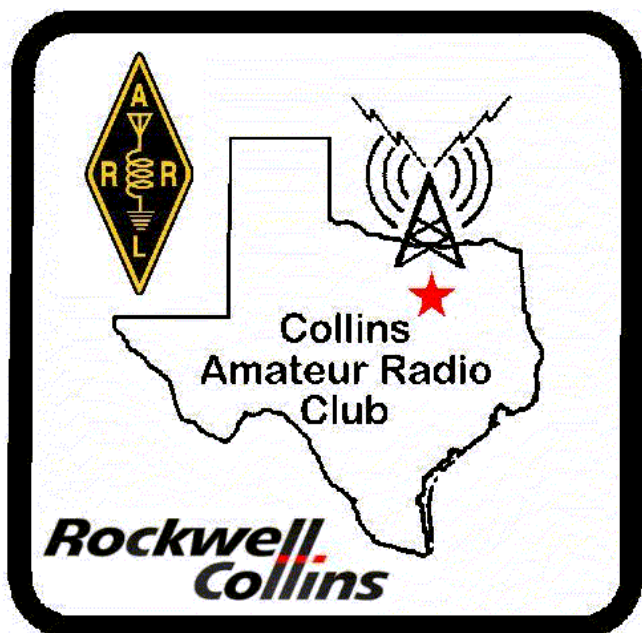
